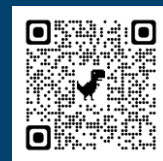


# The Science in the Service Fellowship

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's **Science in the Service Fellowship** may be for you! The fellowship is designed to attract highly talented Fellows with particular attention to women and groups underrepresented in the FWS workforce including Black, Indigenous, People of Color, and individuals with disabilities.

We are seeking interns for a range of developmental internships focused on everything from habitat restoration to the administration of the Endangered Species Act. Internships will take place across California in Arcata, Sacramento, Ventura, Carlsbad, and Kern.

### Applicant Requirements

- Current 3<sup>rd</sup> year or higher undergraduate, graduate student, or recent graduate (graduated in last 2 years)
- GPA of 3.0 or higher
- U.S. Citizen or National, age 18 or older
- Available to work part/full-time (based on availability) beginning in August 2024.

### Benefits of the Program

- Paid developmental internship (1 week in-person orientation, bi-weekly stipend paid based on hours worked)
- Training and project support from federal biologists and hiring specialists
- Non-Competitive Hire Authority for U.S. Department of Interior agencies after completing program requirements
- Locations across California, with telework flexibilities!
- Travel funding provided for training and professional development
